## Weston Foundation continues to support NL charities through CFNL

\$20,000 left over from a large donation from the W. Garfield Weston Foundation in late 2009 enabled the Community Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador to give out more than \$39,000 worth of grants in 2010. The W. Garfield Weston Foundation is run by the Weston family descendants, the owners of Loblaw's Companies Limited.

Most of the grants were awarded to fourteen charities across the province during a ceremony held in March 2010 at the MacMorran Community Centre. Besides the centre, the charities which received funding included Sheshatshiu Innu School, Clarenville High School, Libra House in Happy Valley-Goose Bay, Vibrant Communities, Victorian Order of Nurses, Canadian Paraplegic Association in St. Anthony, Memorial University of NL, St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Boys & Girls Club of St. John's and Junior Achievement NL.

These charities provided help for groups such as disabled people in need of assistance for community readiness in St. Anthony; women who benefit from programs preventing violence against women in Happy Valley-Goose Bay and recovering addicts through a peer-mentored art program in St. John's - to name a few.

Karen Hanlon, CEO of Healing Expressions run by St. Andrew's says, "As a peer-mentored studio we are working to help those who struggle to overcome barriers in the community. Receiving this grant will help members continue to engage in creative self-expression, to make healthier choices and promote recovery."

CFNL also distributed an additional \$5,665 from its Community Fund to the Newfoundland and Labrador Laubach Literacy Council to improve reading skills of students in Corner Brook, the Trinity Historical Society for a documentary on traditional boat building, and the Newfoundland Symphony Orchestra to introduce elementary students to symphony music.

Throughout 2010, an additional \$14,000 in grants was awarded for secondary and post-secondary scholarships for students, to support programs for a parish and developmentally delayed adults and to give 3 young golfers in Labrador an opportunity to play in a tournament in Newfoundland.

"Charities across Newfoundland and Labrador always face a struggle in securing the funds needed to implement programs that benefit the people in their communities." says Jennifer Guy, CFNL Vice-Chair. "We are pleased to be recognized by the Weston family and by our loyal donors as a vehicle for them to support community-based organizations that benefit their clients."

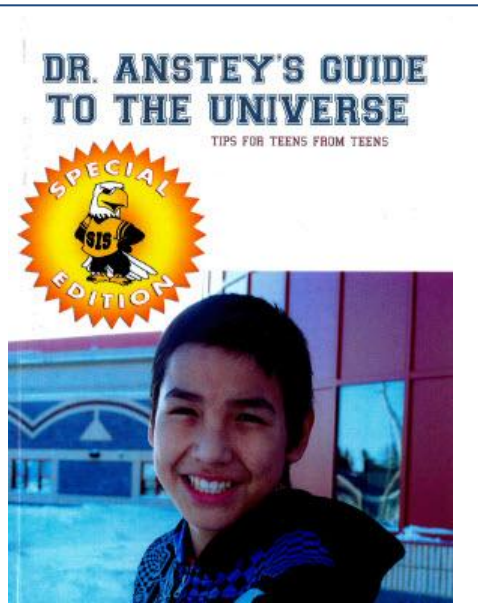
## Foundation Facts:

There are more than 177 community foundations in Canada, in every province and one territory. The combined assets of Community Foundations in 2010 surpassed the \$3 billion dollar mark and they contributed more than \$149 million to charities in communities across the country.
