Vital Signs, our check-up on quality of life in Newfoundland and Labrador, lays out critical statistics on the state of the province, and our grants program provides the resources change-makers need to take action. St. John's Farmers' Market Partners with CFNL to Reach \$100,000 Fundraising Goal

If you spent a morning at the St. John's Farmers' Market in 2015, you know that the popular community event has outgrown its current location at the Lions Club Chalet on Bonaventure Avenue.

The City of St. John's took the lead on creating a new home for the market in the former Metrobus Depot on Freshwater Road. To help with the cost of renovations to the depot, the St. John's Farmers' Market Cooperative committed to fundraise \$100,000.

By starting a short-term fund at the Community Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador, the cooperative was able to offer charitable tax benefits to supporters of the campaign starting in August 2015. Thanks to individual donations, fundraising events, and major contributions from the Aviva Community Fund and VOCM Cares, the market reached its \$100,000 goal at the beginning of December. The amount collected in the Community Foundation fund will be granted directly to the City of St. John's towards the creation of this new public space.

"The larger space means we will be able to accept more vendors and there will be more room for customers to socialize with friends, eat tasty foods, buy great local produce, and pick up some neat local art," says Josh Smee, Chair of the St. John's Farmers' Market's board of directors. "It will be a true community space too, with a community kitchen, a public square, a playground, and much more."

The market's new location is set to open summer 2017. See you there!

New Fund Supports Award for Compassion

When Boyce Taylor passed away unexpectedly from a heart attack while cycling to a family gathering, his friends at the St. John's Shambhala Meditation Group decided to honour his qualities of kindness and patience with a new fund for high school graduates.

The Boyce Taylor Memorial Award for Compassionate Action will be given annually to a graduating student of Holy Heart of Mary High who displays compassion and "is courageous in working towards the elimination of conditions that cause pain to others".

The Boyce Taylor Memorial Fund is the second CFNL fund to support an award that recognizes kindness in youth. The David Stone Memorial Fund supports an award for a student of St. James Regional High in Channel-Port-aux-Basques who demonstrates

Smart & Caring Community Fund

- Coalition of Persons with Disabilities (\$2,000) to provide persons with disabilities across the province with PREP kits, which contain the individual's critical medical and support information for first responders to use in an emergency.
- Kids Eat Smart Foundation (\$1,000) for its Fruit and Veggies First! program, which ensures that school aged children have access to fresh fruits and vegetables through their local Kids Eat Smart Clubs.
- The Literary Arts Foundation of NL (\$2,000) to present 24 readings and writing workshops by Newfoundland and Labrador authors at schools and libraries in St. John's, Corner Brook, and Happy Valley-Goose Bay.
- Newfoundland Symphony Youth Orchestra (\$2,000) to offer music education for elementary-aged children in the Buckmaster's Circle neighbourhood of St. John's, at no cost to participating families.
- O'Brien Farm Foundation (\$2,000) to restore the O'Brien Family Farm's Cottage Garden and outdoor trail ways for public enjoyment, recreation, and education.
- Town of South Brook (\$2,000) to create a community garden that will allow local residents to grow their own produce. The garden aims to give low income families access to fresh produce, to improve community wellness, and to increase sense of belonging.
- Town of Wabana (\$2,000) to build a gazebo in a local park as an out-door gathering and performance space.
- Youth 2000 Centre (\$2,000) in Grand Falls-Windsor for the MAP program, which gives at-risk youth the tools to overcome barriers to housing, education and employment and empowers them to pursue their own life goals.
